(**RENFREW**, **ON**) - The Renfrew Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) investigated 292 calls for service during the past week.

Domestic Violence

Arnprior and Renfrew officers investigated 11 domestic disputes during the past week. One male was charged with assault, one male was charged with uttering threats, two counts of domestic mischief, possession of stolen property and possession of marihuana, one female was charged with assault and one male was charged with break and enter, domestic mischief and two counts of breach of a recognizance. No other criminal offences took place.
